Safety Workshop

Bomb Threats, Suspicious Packages, Improvised Explosive Devices

This presentation will introduce participants to the development of a bomb threat incident plan that will reduce the potential for personal injury and property damage. The program also provides awareness of suspicious parcels and improvised explosive devices. If there is one point that cannot be over-emphasized, it is the value of being prepared.

During this session we will cover the following:

- Define the procedures to be implemented when a bomb threat is received
- · Identify the ways to collect information about the bomb threat that will assist authorities
- Determine training needed for each aspect of the plan
- Identify pre-event, actualized event and post-event procedures

Protecting America's Third Branch of Government

This program will provide participants with guidance related to the risks confronting America's courts and best practices for protecting the judicial system.

During this session we will cover the following:

- Familiarize participants with commonly encountered emergencies, disasters and catastrophes
- Provide emergency preparedness and response guidance
- Discuss the difference between EAP (Emergency Action Plan), EOP (Emergency Operations Plan and COOP (Continuity of Operations Plan)
- Describe common behaviors, conditions and situations associated with emergent risks

Civil Unrest Tabletop Exercise

Although this exercise focuses on judges, district court administrators and judicial professionals, the principles can be applied to all other county operations. It provides participants with a forum for participants to respond to a hypothetical scenario involving rapidly escalating and cascading civil unrest.

During this session we will cover the following:

- Familiarize participants with the characteristics of a civil unrest event
- Promote collaboration among judges, government officials, sheriffs and public safety agencies
- Engage participants in decision making based on rapidly evolving information
- Describe common behaviors, conditions and situations associated with civil unrest
- Provide information that will assist stakeholders to enhance emergency preparedness

Recruitment and Retention Strategies - Creating a More Diverse and Inclusive Workplace – Representatives from Campbell Durrant P.C.

This session will identify policies that you should be updating not only to comply with anti-discrimination laws but also to maximize recruitment and retention. The session will also review the recent U.S. Supreme Court precedent relating to affirmative action and the impact it may have on an employer's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion initiatives. As Zoomers enter the workforce, and the laws surrounding diversity and inclusion continue to be ever changing, many employers are wondering which topics are safe ground during the recruiting and hiring process. Even more so, as the new generation is seeking more flexibility at work, managers and human resources professionals are balancing the emerging needs of a younger workforce and the demands of operating county government. This session will review best practices for inclusive recruiting, hiring and retention as the workforce transitions from Boomer to Zoomer.

Al and HR: Benefit or Curse? - Renee Montgomery, Esquire and Michael Miller, Esquire from Eckert Seamans Cherin & Mellott, LLC.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) promises benefits to human resource professionals including: 1) a better interview process for an enhanced candidate experience; 2) a more efficient onboarding cycle for seamless integration; and 3) effective employee engagement to boost retention rate. AI has also sparked new legal challenges including changes to the EEOC guidance and a focus on illegal exclusion created by the use of AI in applicant screening. We will discuss the challenges and best practices involved in embracing AI in the workplace.

How to Use Legal Counsel (An Essential Guide for County HR Manager) – Christopher Gabriel, Esquire and Stephania Fera, Esquire from Gabriel Fera P.C.

This session will identify and explain the five main roles that lawyers can and should play for your county. We will then explore from the lawyer's perspective the skills and tools available to help us fill those roles effectively. The takeaways from this session should be: 1) an enhanced ability to know when to call in the services of legal counsel, and 2) a more-informed understanding of how to get the most out of your interactions with your lawyers.

Prison Personnel Workshop

Prison work is highly complex and requires a variety of skills. This year we will highlight the following topics to continue to educate your team of the law, coverage, available training and grant opportunities offered through PCoRP.

- Prison Risk Management Reviews This session will provide recommendations found during these reviews to help limit your potential liability exposures at your facility.
- Surprise You've Been Sued Now What? This session is for all prison personnel, on what to expect following being officially served a lawsuit from an event that happened at your correctional facility. During this session we will talk about the Law Enforcement Liability Coverage afforded to participating PCoRP Members and how coverage responds to protect counties and named prison personnel. You will learn more about PCoRP, our processes, claims handling, when and how defense counsel is assigned and, most importantly, the obligations of the member and covered defendants for coverage to apply. We will conclude with common questions the Claims Team fields from prison personnel and conclude with a Q&A segment fielding questions from the audience.





More Than Just Insurance!



PIMCC - PRISON INMATE MEDICAL COST CONTAINMENT

PIMCC provides medical cost management and education to assist county prisons with the containment of costs related to inmate medical expenses. Services include inmate medical bill auditing, case management/concurrent inpatient review, group prescription purchasing program, medical provider fee negotiations and correctional care educational opportunities.



COMCARE PRO - BEHAVIORAL HEALTH STOP LOSS REINSURANCE

COMCARE PRO provides stop-loss liability insurance to Pennsylvania counties and non-profit corporations whose sole members are Pennsylvania counties. Subscribers are partially reimbursed in excess of their attachment point for costs incurred in meeting their obligations under agreements with the HealthChoices program of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.



TAX COLLECTOR BONDS - TAX COLLECTOR SURETY BOND PROGRAM

The Tax Collector Bond program provides surety bond coverage for tax collectors as required by state law. Protection applies only to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the named county, the named municipality and the named school district.



VOLUNTEERS - SPECIAL RISK ACCIDENT INSURANCE FOR VOLUNTEERS

The Volunteers program provides insurance coverage for accidental death, dismemberment and **Volunteers** medical expenses for county volunteers. Volunteers are not covered under the Pennsylvania Workers' Compensation Act, and this program can provide this special risk service for your county. Coverage also extends to court-referred alternative sentencing, work release and juveniles participating under the Juvenile Tobacco Enforcement Program. This insurance is in excess of any other insurance in place for volunteers.



PACAH BONDS - PATIENT TRUST FUND BONDS FOR NURSING HOMES

PACAH Bonds are patient trust fund bonds for nursing home residents and are provided to meet the requirements of federal law. The bond program is available for Pennsylvania Association of County Affiliated Homes (PACAH) members through Travelers Casualty and Surety Company at very competitive group rates. Bonds are written for a two-year period.

Note: These are summary explanations of each program. Please see each program's detailed coverage descriptions, coverage documents and bylaws for full details.
